Global climate models have relatively coarse spatial resolution. If you want to know how temperatures or precipitation might change on finer spatial scales, you need to downscale the climate model output. Through collaborative efforts, a statistical downscaling of four global climate models called Localized Constructed Analogs (LOCA) was completed which led to the development of the Cal-Adapt Tools.
