Kumar & Vinod (2014) was observed that the most notable effect of tourism on traditional values and culture is a certain social and human interactions change into the commercialization of cultural values and traditions at the destination for the purpose of earning of a living. It was indicated that with the introduction of tourism at large-scale in developing countries, goods and/or services that used to be part of people's individual and social life have been commercialized and presented as commodities. In the 2020 research paper titled "Role of Hospitality Sector in Promoting Adventure Tourism – Study of Himachal Pradesh," Ashutosh Sharma and Dr. Praveen Chauhan present insights into the current state of the tourism industry.
